	Whereas, Physicians practice under the umbrella of contract law as a service provider; and	
	Whereas, When a service is provided, the contracting entity owes the physician for that service; and	
	Whereas, If the physician has a contract with the patient's insurance, the insurance is obligated to pay for that service; and	
	Whereas, In most cases, the physician has agreed to bill that insurance and await payment for those services; and	
	Whereas, The insurance company is usually contracted to pay for all covered services provided; and	
	Whereas, Increasingly third-party payers are delaying payment by requesting documentation of service provided prior to paying for that service; and	
	Whereas, This unnecessarily delays payment and places a high burden of time and extra work on the physicians staff; and	
	Whereas, The payers have always, and continue to have, the ability to ask for documentation after payment is made and if the payment was incorrect, recouping the money; therefore be it	
	RESOLVED, That our American Medical Association work with all payers to ensure that they stop the practice of delaying payments by asking for documentation to review, prior to payment (Directive to Take Action); and be it further	
	RESOLVED, That our AMA work with payers to establish rules to continue to allow the payer to conduct prepayment documentation review if the payer has performed a post payment documentation review and proven that the provider has been submitting incorrect claims (Directive to Take Action); and be it further	
	RESOLVED, That if efforts to work with payers to end the practice of delaying payments without reasonable justification fail, our AMA seek legislation that would accomplish this. (Directive to Take Action)
